Use graphic organizers for brainstorming activities to build comprehension, enhance student thinking and improve organizational skills. Create content webs and add images and videos to build a classroom resource for students to use as a reference.

Create a Classroom Resource – The Impact of the Lewis & Clark Expedition

- Step 1 Open Inspiration software, brainstorm activity with students creating brainstorming web.
- Step 2 Select File, New, **Outline** to begin your brainstorming session.
- Step 3 **Rename** your “Main Idea” icon by double clicking in the icon and typing ‘Lewis & Clark. The icon can be changed by selecting one from the Symbols library.
- Step 4 Click on the ‘Rapid Fire’  option to type in student brainstorming responses and create your web.
- Step 5 Log on to Discovery Education *streaming* and search for videos that correspond to your content. Download selected video clips to your local computer. Be sure that you are downloading **QuickTime** (.mov) movie segments. For instructions on changing your setting, consult your Quick Start Card.
- Step 6 To insert a video clip, first select the symbol for the video by single-clicking on it. On the menu bar, select “Tools,” then select “Insert video or sound,” then “video.”
- Step 7 Browse your computer to locate the video you want to insert. Single Click on the title, then select “Open.” A link to the video will be created and the movie icon will be displayed. Double click on the video to view.
